The **Federation of Ontario Naturalists** (FON), established in 1931, is a provincially-based non-governmental charitable organization which protects and increases awareness of Ontario's natural areas and wildlife.

The FON currently has 15 000 individual members and a network of 80 local groups - 63 community-based naturalists' clubs and 17 associated groups. The FON is governed by a Board of Directors that represents the individual members, naturalists' clubs, and associated groups.

The FON is a leader in promoting the preservation of wetland habitats; the creation and management of parks; protection for Ontario's rare, threatened, and endangered species; and responsible forest management. The FON publishes *Seasons* magazine; produces a range of environmental education resources for schools and youth groups; and has an extensive program of trips, tours, and summer camps. As well, over the past 30 years, the FON has assembled the province's largest private nature reserve system.

The *Atlas of the Mammals of Ontario* is the result of a four year project to collect information on the distribution of Ontario's 86 wild mammal species. Over 161 000 records were collected and used to compile detailed distribution maps for each species. The final result is the best available representation of the distribution of Ontario's mammals and a benchmark with which to compare past and future changes in distribution. The *Atlas of the Mammals of Ontario* will be of particular interest to naturalists, biologists, environmental consultants and planners, but will be a welcome reference for anyone interested in Ontario's wildlife.
